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Scholarship Information

Applying for Scholarships

- 1. Must be a Shawnee College in-district resident
- Read each scholarship description CAREFULLY and select any scholarships for which you meet all qualifications.
- 3. Fill out the online Scholarship Application at https://shawneecc.academicworks.com.
- If a <u>high school transcript</u> is required, the transcript must include the class rank and high school guidance counselor's signature.
- 5. Upload any required attachments directly through the online application.
- 6. Return portfolios (if required) to office or person listed, unless you can upload them through the online application.

Requirements for Recipients

- 1. An in-district student must provide proof of indistrict residency within 30 days of the start of the semester or must meet the scholarship requirements.
- Preference given to students who are not near degree completion. Scholarship may be void upon degree completion.
- 3. Scholarships must be <u>initiated by the fall semester after</u> receiving award.
- Cannot receive a scholarship at SCC if only attending the summer semester following the award; <u>Must attend the fall semester following receipt of</u> <u>scholarship</u>.
- Must complete a FAFSA for the award year beginning in the fall. The application is available on October 1st for the following award year.
- 6. Must enroll at SCC in an AA, AS, or AAS curriculum (unless otherwise noted).
- 7. Must not be enrolled in a regular program at another college.
- 8. Meet the requirements to keep the scholarship for the next semester or second year.
- 9. Students must remain in good standing as determined by the college.
- 10. Must pay on time any debts owed to the college.
- 11. All GPA requirements are based on a 4.00 grading scale.
- 12. <u>Must be continuously enrolled with no break in</u> <u>attendance</u>.

Award Letter

Once a scholarship is awarded, the student must immediately designate in writing if they choose to decline the scholarship. <u>Once the recipient declines the scholarship, it may no longer be available</u>.

Information in this booklet is subject to change without notice. All scholarships are pending funding availability.

Internal Scholarships

Gold Scholarships

Full in-district tuition, fees, and book loan (except consumables).

Must complete a minimum of <u>15 volunteer service hours</u> through SCC each fall and spring semester.

Silver Scholarships

Maximum: In-district tuition for 6 hours during summer, 15 hours during fall, and 15 hours during spring (fees and books are not covered).

Must complete a minimum of <u>10 volunteer service hours</u> through SCC each fall and spring semester.

Bronze Scholarships

Maximum: In-district tuition for 3 hours during summer, 7 hours during fall, and 7 hours during spring (fees and books are not covered).

Hours paid are based on the number of hours enrolled in each semester (up to the maximum for each scholarship).

No cash can be received from Gold, Silver, or Bronze scholarships.

More information about volunteer service hours will be available through the Financial Aid Office. Scholarship recipients will receive an e-mail (through their SCC e-mail account) with details after the beginning of the fall semester.

<u>Book Loan</u>

For scholarships that include a book loan, the SCC Bookstore will charge a \$100 book deposit when scholarship students pick up their textbooks. This deposit may be paid by cash, check, credit/debit card, or financial aid. The deposit will be refunded providing all books/DVDs are in good condition and are returned by the last day of scheduled semester buybacks. Deposits will be forfeited after said date and holds (along with book charges) will be placed against the student's account until unreturned book charges have been paid. Students must pay for these items upfront with cash, check, credit/debit card, or financial aid.

Books must be returned at the end of each semester. Books must be returned in good condition or the student will be responsible for paying for that book. Contact the Bookstore for additional details regarding book returns.

Consumables are not covered by scholarships.

Consumables include textbooks with access codes, lab manuals, workbooks, and connect cards.

Failure To Meet Requirements

Shawnee Community College (SCC) reserves the right to alter or cancel individual scholarships at any time for failure to meet the requirements. When one of the stated standards is not met, the student will lose the scholarship. Once a student has lost an SCC scholarship for any reason, it cannot be resumed at a later date unless extenuating circumstances can be proven. <u>The student is responsible</u> for making sure all requirements are met.

GENERAL FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION

FAFSA Form

The first step is to complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). With this form, students automatically apply for a Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG), Work-Study, and MAP (Illinois residents). <u>The FAFSA must also be completed when applying for scholarships</u>.

The FAFSA must be filled out each academic year. Application can begin on October 1 for the upcoming fall semester. The FAFSA is available online at <u>http://www.fafsa.gov</u>.

Federal and state grants are based on family need. Financial need is the difference between the cost of attending SCC for one year and the amount your family can be expected to pay. For financial aid purposes, your Expected Family Contribution (EFC) is based on the information you submit on the FAFSA.

Satisfactory Academic Progress

Students must be making Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) toward a degree to keep federal or state financial aid. The SAP Policy is available in the college catalog.

After Submitting The FAFSA

After submitting your FAFSA, you will receive your Student Aid Report (SAR) either through e-mail or by mail. The SAR informs you of Federal Pell Grant eligibility. Review the SAR carefully for any missing information or errors. <u>If you find any</u> <u>errors, access www.fafsa.gov</u> to make needed corrections.

Federal Pell Grant

The Pell Grant is the basis for all federal financial aid and is given to students who have financial need and meet federal eligibility requirements. Pell Grants may range up to \$6,195 per year (these numbers may change slightly each year).

Pell Grants are based upon the number of eligible credit hours a student is enrolled in on Pell Status Day. This is before the mid-term date of each semester. If enrolled in classes that begin after the regular start date of a semester, please contact the Financial Aid Office regarding the date financial aid will be released for those classes. Half of the annual Pell amount will be paid in the fall semester and the ther half will be paid in the spring semester. Summer Pell may be available. Check with the Financial Aid Office for details. The federal school code for Shawnee Community College is **007693**.

NOTE: Courses repeated after a student has received a grade of A, B, C, or D will not be counted in determining the amount of federally-funded or state-funded financial aid, including the federal Pell grant and the state Monetary Award Program (MAP) grant, unless certain conditions exist. See the college catalog for details regarding repeating courses.

Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG)

FSEOGs are awarded to students who have the greatest financial need and apply early. Amounts vary based on annual funding levels.

Monetary Award Program (MAP)

The Monetary Award Program (MAP) grant is a statefunded grant that is awarded to eligible students. It is based on the Expected Family Contribution (EFC), which is determined by the information reported on the FAFSA. Students (parents, if dependent) must meet Illinois residency requirements and be enrolled in at least three credit hours. The MAP grant will only pay a portion of the tuition at the SCC in-district rate.

Federal and Institutional Work-Study

The Work-Study program gives students an opportunity to earn money while gaining valuable work experience. Many jobs are available through the Work-Study program. Students can work up to 20 hours per week with the convenience of supervisors working around their course schedules.

Shawnee College maintains a listing of both on- and offcampus work and community service jobs through Work-Study. Open jobs are posted on the main campus (across the hall from the Bursar's Office), at the extension centers, and online at <u>http://www.shawneecc.edu</u> under "Employment at SCC." Students must see the Financial Aid Office to apply for open jobs.
