### Saints Awards & SAINTS Foundation Scholarships Information

Shawnee Community College and the Shawnee Community College Foundation have created many financial opportunities to make education affordable. These opportunities can assist students in making their education and career dreams a reality.

#### <u>Applying for Saints Awards & Saints Foundation</u> Scholarships

- 1. Shawnee Community College in-district students will be given preference.
- 2. Read each description CAREFULLY and select any for which you meet all qualifications.
- The student must complete the Saints Award & Scholarship Application at https://shawneecc.academicworks.com.
- 4. Submit a high school, GED, or college transcript dependent on student education level.
- 5. Upload any required attachments directly through the online application.

#### **Requirements for Recipients of Saints Awards**

- 1. Must complete a 2025-2026 FAFSA.
- 2. Students planning to attend in the Summer following high school graduation also need to submit a 2024-2025 FAFSA.
- 3. Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or above (unless otherwise indicated).
- Students who have already completed a Bachelor's Degree do not need to complete the FAFSA. Contact the Financial Aid Office to submit verification of Bachelor's Degree.
- 5. Saints Awards & Saints Foundation Scholarships must be initiated by the fall semester after receiving award.
- 6. Must enroll at SCC in an AA, AS, or AAS or academic certificate program of study.
- 7. Must not be enrolled as a full-time student at another college.
- 8. Meet the requirements to keep the award/scholarship for the next semester.
- 9. Must maintain full time student status except for Vice-President's Non-Traditional Saints Award.
- 10. Must pay any outstanding debts owed to the college.
- 11. Must be continuously enrolled with no break in attendance (excluding summer semesters).
- 12. Typically, when a student is eligible for other types of financial aid such as Pell Grants or MAP grants, those funds will be applied first. Consequently, the Saints Award will be adjusted accordingly to cover only the remaining charges that the student has.
- The awarding of Saints Awards will not result in a student cash refund.

#### **Offer Letter**

Once an award/scholarship is offered, the student must immediately designate in writing if they choose to accept or decline the award/scholarship by the deadline date on offer letter. Once the recipient declines the scholarship, it may no longer be available.

#### **Failure to Meet Requirements**

Shawnee Community College (SCC) reserves the right to alter or cancel individual scholarships at any time for failure to meet the requirements. When one of the stated standards is not met, the student will lose the scholarship. Once a student has lost an SCC scholarship for any reason, it cannot be resumed at a later date unless extenuating circumstances can be proven through a processed appeal. The student is responsible for making sure all requirements are met.

#### **GENERAL FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION**

#### **FULL-TIME STUDENT**

A full-time student is one who carries 12 or more credit hours during the fall and spring semesters or six or more credit hours during the fall semester.

#### **FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)**

The first step is to complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). With this form, students automatically apply for a Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG), Work-Study, and MAP (Illinois residents). The FAFSA must also be completed when applying for scholarships.

The FAFSA must be filled out each academic year. The FAFSA will be available online at <a href="http://www.fafsa.gov">http://www.fafsa.gov</a>. Shawnee Community College School code: **007693** 

Federal and state grants are based on family need. Financial need is the difference between the cost of attending SCC for one year and the amount a family can expect to pay. For financial aid purposes, the Student Aid Index (SAI) indicates the student/family's ability to pay for college and is based on the information submitted on the FAFSA.

#### After Submitting The FAFSA

After submitting the FAFSA, the student will receive a FAFSA Submission Summary (previously a Student Aid Report) either through email or by mail. The Summary informs Federal Pell Grant eligibility. Students should review the Summary carefully for any missing information or errors and make corrections by accessing <a href="https://www.fafsa.gov">www.fafsa.gov</a>.

#### TYPES of AWARDS

#### Saints Foundation Scholarships

Shawnee Community College SAINTS Foundation scholarships are made possible by supportive individuals, families, alumni, community businesses and organizations, as well as through employee giving. Some foundation scholarships are awarded based on various criteria established by the donor.

#### Federal Pell Grant

The Pell Grant is the basis for all federal financial aid and is given to students who have financial need and meet federal eligibility requirements.

## Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG)

FSEOGs are awarded to students who have the greatest financial need and apply early. Amounts vary based on annual funding levels.

#### Monetary Award Program (MAP)

The Monetary Award Program (MAP) grant is a state funded grant that is awarded to eligible students. It is based on the Student Aid Index (SAI), which is determined by the information reported on the FAFSA. Students must meet Illinois residency requirements and be enrolled in at least three credit hours. Students should complete the FAFSA as soon as possible to increase the possibility of eligibility.

#### Federal & Institutional Work Study (FWS)

The Work-Study program gives students an opportunity to earn money while gaining valuable work experience. Students should contact the Financial Aid Office to apply for open jobs.

#### Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)

Students must be making Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) toward a degree to keep federal or state financial aid and Saints Awards. The SAP Policy is available in the college catalog.
