Shawnee Community College History

Shawnee Community College was organized as a Class I community college in September of 1967. Created to serve Southern Illinois and its people, the college district covers all of Alexander, Massac, Pulaski, Union, and parts of Johnson and Jackson counties.

The initial seven-member Board of Trustees was selected in December of 1967. These seven men ascertained the principles around which the college would be built. Dr. Loren E. Klaus was named the founding and first president in May of 1968. He oversaw the temporary campus facility design and construction, hiring administrators and instructors, course offerings, and, in his sixth year as President, the design and eventual construction of the permanent SCC facility. At that time, SCC had the highest ratio of Ph.D. instructors to students of any institution of higher learning in Illinois. The College officially opened on September 24, 1969. He remained SCC President until late 1987, just shy of 20 years. In March 2022, Dr. Klaus passed away at the age of 93.

In July of 1987, Dr. Barry Gowin was selected as the second president of the Shawnee Community College District. An additional 21,000-square-foot classroom building was completed in January of 1989 to provide a biology laboratory, a nursing laboratory, general classrooms, and one large-group meeting room.

In January of 1991, Dr. Jack D. Hill was appointed as the third president of Shawnee Community College. During his tenure, he uplifted the institution and renewed its spirit through his integrity and morale-building leadership. During his presidency, the College expanded extension centers and experienced a large growth in the number of students who attended. He initiated and built financial support for the construction of building K which houses the Educational Center, computer labs, the biology lab, general classrooms, and faculty offices. In 1996, Dr. Jack Hill was selected as the first President Emeritus of Shawnee Community College for his initiative and foresight.

In August of 1996, Dr. Terry G. Ludwig was selected as the fourth president of Shawnee Community College. During his tenure, the College experienced growth in numbers of students, staff, programs, and grants. The College also opened the 33,000-square-foot Educational Center in August 2000, secured funding for the 10,500-square-foot Metropolis Regional Education and Training Center in Metropolis City Industrial Park, opened a computer lab and fitness facility in the Alexander County Housing Authority in Cairo, Illinois, and planned a Regional Education Center in Cairo, Illinois.

Dr. Larry D. Choate assumed the duties of the fifth president of Shawnee Community College on January 1, 2005. Before this appointment, Dr. Choate

served as the vice president of instruction since January 1, 1988. Dr. Choate initiated the College's continuous quality improvement and strategic planning process. Dr. Choate supported the expansion of instructional services to students with the addition of internet courses, interactive television, and telecourse offerings.

Dr. Larry Peterson was named the sixth president of Shawnee Community College in December 2007. After being named the president, Dr. Peterson quickly reached out to the supporters of the College through an effort called "Shawnee United." He also initiated a vast advertising campaign titled "I am Shawnee Community College" highlighting the success stories of graduates. Dr. Peterson oversaw the relocation to a state-of-the-art Anna Extension Center facility. Also, Dr. Peterson reached out to economic development entities throughout the college district to create partnerships between the college and business and industry to bring economic growth to the southernmost part of Illinois.


On August 1, 2012, Dr. Tim Bellamey assumed the duties as the seventh president of Shawnee Community College. Dr. Bellamey served the college since 1982 in a variety of positions before being named Vice President of Instructional Services in 2005. The preparation of students for the twenty-first-century workforce through the development of relevant career and technical career training programs was a primary goal of Dr. Bellamey. In support of that goal, the new Career and Technical Center opened in the fall of 2013 on the main campus.

On June 14, 2017, Peggy F. J. Bradford, J.D. Ed.D, was named the eighth president of Shawnee Community College. Dr. Bradford is a Southern Illinois native, a graduate of Meridian High School, and attended Shawnee Community College where she earned her Associate of Arts degree. During her time at Shawnee, Dr. Bradford utilized a student-centered approach to enrollment, retention, graduation, and employment. Dr. Bradford oversaw the reopening of the Cairo Center, established the Vienna Center, secured multiple internships, partnerships, scholarships and donations for the College, re-introduced volleyball and cheerleading, and has re-established both the Saint's Foundation and Saints Alumni Association. Dr. Bradford focused on student success, teaching and learning, community engagement, industry workforce needs, and strategic planning. President Bradford secured a six million dollar bond to update campus-wide technology, compensation study, and website upgrades.

On September 9, 2020, Dr. Tim Taylor was named the ninth president of Shawnee Community College. With an extensive background in academic leadership, community partnerships, and performance-based curriculum design, Dr. Taylor brings tremendous depth and leadership focused on student success. Dr. Taylor is truly an example of the successful foundation available through the Illinois community college system. He holds a Ph.D. in Educational Leadership & Policy Analysis from the University of Wisconsin, a Masters in Science in Vocational Education from Southern Illinois University, a B.S. in Electronics Management

from Southern Illinois University, an A.A.S. in Electronics Technology, an A.A.S. in Industrial Maintenance, and a Certificate in Welding from Danville Area Community College. He began his career in a faculty role and quickly moved to leadership positions in business, technology, skilled trades, and agriculture. Over the past year, Dr. Taylor has engaged hundreds of students and staff, as well as several community members and organizations. He lives out the College motto "Student Centered....Community Connected". Always engaging, forever collaborating, and completely transparent is the culture of the College we offer to our students. Dr. Taylor received the Illinois Region of Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society's Paragon President Award earlier this year. "This award recognizes new college presidents for their outstanding support of student success. We know the depth of each member's experience has a lot to do with the value placed on Phi Theta Kappa by college leaders" - Phi Theta Kappa. Dr. Taylor joined members of PTK at the group's Catalyst 22 Convention in April to receive the award.

James was more than a Trustee – he was a lifelong champion of Shawnee College and the communities we serve. Before joining the Board, James dedicated many years to our Adult Education Department, helping countless individuals transform their lives through learning. His passion for the College was unmatched – James bled Shawnee maroon, believed fiercely in our mission, and cared deeply about our students, faculty, staff, and community.

James faced and overcame many health challenges, including a double-lung transplant, with remarkable resilience and courage. No matter the circumstance, he remained a source of positivity, always wearing a contagious smile that lifted the spirits of everyone around him.

On a personal note, James was a trusted supporter, advocate, and friend. He was someone I could always bounce ideas off of, and he helped me think through many important issues when I first became President. His encouragement, wisdom, and steady presence will be deeply missed.

Born in Nashville and raised in Southern Illinois, Shannon's journey reflects her commitment to service, equity, and education. As a graduate student, she co-founded a library outreach program to support individuals experiencing homelessness. She contributed to developing a recidivism reduction policy manual at the Center for Empowerment and Justice.

Shannon also played a pivotal role in establishing the TRIO computer lab at Shawnee Community College, helping bridge the digital divide for needy students. She credits her time at Shawnee and her support from Student Support Services as foundational to her success as a first-generation college graduate.

Based in Greater Atlanta, Shannon continues her mission through various leadership roles. She has served as a Child Protective Services Investigations Supervisor for the State of Georgia and as a Lead Adolescent Behavioral Health Therapist. Her work extends beyond clinical practice, including community engagement as a Girl Scouts of America Troop Leader and involvement in violence prevention initiatives with the DeKalb County Government.

Shannon supervises Master of Social Work students at Georgia State University, mentoring them as they develop a youth anti-violence curriculum for their senior capstone projects. Her dedication to shaping the next generation of social workers underscores her lasting impact on the profession. In recognition of her service and advocacy, Shannon received the Distinguished Alumni Award from Shawnee Community College. She is a proud member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated. She actively serves in multiple ministries at New Mercies Christian Church, exemplifying her commitment to faith-based service and leadership.

Above all, Shannon is a devoted mother of three and a role model who encourages others to pursue growth, resilience, and purpose. As a Licensed Master Social Worker, she leads with compassion, humility, and a deep sense of responsibility to her community.

The American academic regalia was established in 1985. It consists of three types of gowns, three styles of hoods, and two kinds of cap tassels. bachelor's gown has long, pointed open sleeves with no ornamentation. The master's gown has even longer sleeves, which are closed at the bottom but feature openings about halfway down for the hands. The doctoral gown has fulllength laps of velvet and bell-shaped sleeves with three horizontal velvet bars. The color of caps and gowns is usually black; however, some universities feature doctoral gowns of distinctive colors.

The students are wearing black gowns. The gold chords and tassels are worn by some of the graduates to indicate the designation of "honor graduate" meaning they are graduating with a 3.5 or higher grade point average. The red, white, and blue chords worn by some of the graduates indicate current or past service in the United States Armed Forces. A traditional mortarboard cap is being worn. The tassel is worn over the right temple, just outside the right eye, and should be shifted from one side to the other once all graduates have received their diplomas.

~The Mace~

Maces are carried at the beginning of academic processions at many universities and colleges worldwide, representing each institution's authority to confer degrees.

~The Seal~

The College seal is the formal mark of the college. The shield represents the dedication Shawnee Community College has to its purposes, students and community. The three sections of the shield represent the quality, cost-effective and comprehensive programs offered at Shawnee Community College. Education sits in the lower section of the shield to symbolize that it is the foundation of Shawnee Community College. This section of the shield embodies two symbols representing the general educational opportunities available at Shawnee Community College: The oil lamp stands for the continuous efforts Shawnee Community College makes to provide the best and most up-to-date education possible. The open book represents how this education is offered to all. The upper section of the shield is split into two categories representing Shawnee Community College's training and industry opportunities: The pie-chart and gears represent the business, technology, and vocational opportunities available. The atom represents the science and allied health at Shawnee Community College.

~The President's Medallion~

Medallions, as worn in higher education, represent the evolution of a practice arising in the Middle Ages and the very early beginnings of universities in the Western World. The Medallion identifies the wearer as the designated leader of the university or college. Representing both the authority and the responsibility of the person who wears it, the Medallion is worn by the president of the university or college at formal academic occasions. The face of the medallion is a replica of the seal of the university or college.
