# X. VPSA Updates

- Mary Coleman, Interim Director of Financial Aid, has begun. She will be working remotely and will be on campus once a month.
  - The Director of Financial Aid's position has been posted. Hoping this individual can be hired and trained while Mary is still with us.
- Expecting everyone who has received an assignment from Erin King to support the Student Success Saturday event.
- The Week of Welcome (WOW) calendar will be shared with everyone via email.
- Interviews have taken place for the Director of Enrollment and Recruiter positions.
- Working on restructuring the Student Affairs division. The conclusion is coming soon.
- The Calming and Veterans room moves have been completed.
- Supervisory Skills Training will be available for anyone unable to attend.
- Carrie Davis will be the contact advisor for the CBE program
- Navigate 360 is live with both recruitment and student success.
- SCC was approved for the Applied Trades and Clinical Health Specialist certificate programs.
- House Bill 3522 Public University Direct Admission Program Act
  - Creates a statewide direct admission program that guarantees qualified Illinois high school seniors and community college students automatic general admission into public universities and community colleges. This aim is to simplify access, remove barriers, and increase postsecondary enrollment, especially for underserved student populations.
- The VPSA will be representing SCC at the Pope County Open House on Friday, August 8.

### XI. Cabinet Updates

- Improve communications
  - The VPSA asked the leaders to share information from the SALT meetings with their staff.
  - Miscommunication has contributed to a negative climate.
- Dr. Teske was awarded a Rev Up grant of \$235,000.
  - Promotes the development and growth of training programs that prepare individuals for careers in EV technology and EV-specific advanced manufacturing fields.
- Ongoing conversations to repair the baseball fence and dugout.
- Working on combining Lunch with Leadership and Fall Fest.
- Working on using the shared governance system to be more empowered to maximize our potential.
- HR Supervisory Role Clarification
  - Supervisors are responsible for helping and developing employees, and HR ensures consistency and accountability.
  - o Job descriptions are being reviewed.



- Supervisors should not try to do conflict resolution. Notify HR immediately about significant issues, arguments, or fights.
- Employee Relations is having conversations about a new dress code standard.
